# **Building update**

On Monday we were extremely excited to welcome our Year 7 students officially back on site and into the new 'village' with a smooth transition.

This has been what feels like a long time to finally see the students back in lessons at Scalby School. I would like to thank you and your children for your patience and co-operation over the past 7 months during this process.

Also, I would like to say a big thank you to all the staff involved with this and to the Scarborough UTC for providing a safe and welcoming environment for our students.

There are still some finishing touches to complete in some of the rooms, but we hope to be fully functional over the next few weeks.

The new part of the school will provide extra teaching rooms including new Science Labs, new kitchens for Food Technology, music rooms and a gym for P.E.















Work is now starting on a plan to build a new canteen extension and the remodelling of our outside space. I expect this work to be completed ready for students coming back in September.

### Year 11 Exams

We have had some of our Year 11 students start their GCSE Art and French assessments this week, with only 5 days until the rest of our Year 11 students start their exams.
